Tuberose (polianthus ) by the clump of tubers-bulbs in 6"pot / Full sun./ Sends up 3 to 4' stalk with very fragrant white blooms. Need to dig up and store over winter. Clumps have many bulbs. Some very small. So I plant whole clump only dividing out the bigger bulbs and planting separate.

That summer, it bloomed for the first time in thirty years. I have seen it blooming in full shade with no water in a nature preserve in Yucatan. I have also seen it in full-sun desert
