Harvest of Hope- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic there are several needs for volunteers:

- Van Driver ... Driving a full size van (no special training needed). Lifting boxes up to 40 lbs. Typically 2-3 hours per collection/distribution run.

- Helper ... Lifting boxes up to 40 lbs. Filling out the run log sheet. Same hours as the driver.

Note that the driver-helper teams have additional Covid-19 risk as they (although masked) are working together.

- Sorting/organizing frozen meat boxes for delivery. One person: 2-3 days per week, for 1-2 hours/day, flexible hours.

- Cleaning the van ... Cleaning the inside of the van and running it through an automatic car wash. One person: 2 hours per week, flexible hours.
