Why did FUUSM go solar?

FUUSM's first step in using solar energy was long considered. The congregation is a certified Green Sanctuary, concerned with environmental justice and "green" practices in the life of the congregation and the lives of individual members. Following the Seventh Principle - Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part - the congregation's Green Sanctuary Committee and the Buildings and Grounds committee studied the feasibility of installing solar panels. Numerous energysaving actions were taken and repairs to the building were made, including substantial repairs to the church roof. Once those were completed, the Green Sanctuary Committee made several presentations promoting the advantages of solar power. No grant money was available for the project, but a member of the congregation proposed that his company, Golden Rule, LLC, finance the project and receive payment from the congregation from savings on electric utility bills. In October 2016 Pickering Energy Solutions completed the installation of solar panels on the roof of the church building, and on November 4, 2016, the solar array began generating electricity for the church building. For much of the year, the panels will produce more energy than is required for the Sanctuary and Social Hall. Expanding the array and adding the RE/Office building to the solar power plant is the church's next step. We are grateful to Golden Rule, LLC, for stepping up again to finance additional panels. With that in mind, the anonymous donor who challenged FUUSM with an offer to match donations up to \$10,000 to expand the solar array agreed to apply the match grant to making the RE/Office Building as energy efficient as possible. Bringing FUUSM Into The 21st Century

In 1855, Nahum Ward, a prominent land speculator and philanthropist, pursued the establishment of a Unitarian Society in Marietta. Financed by Mr. Ward, construction of the church began shortly thereafter. The building was completed in 1857 and sold to the congregation for one dollar. The church's Gothic Revival design, featured both inside and out, reflects the style preferences of the 19th century. In 2016, an array of solar panels was installed on the roof. Today's congregation believes that the forward-thinking Mr. Ward would be pleased to see that the beautiful, historic elements of the building have been maintained but would appreciate the adaptations made to meet current

The donor placed the \$10,000 in the Marietta Community Foundation. Arrangements have been made for a special fund (off FUUSM's operational budget) in the FUUSM budget to collect donations. FUUSM's Board of Trustees has discussed this with FUUSM treasurer Linda Lawton, and it is set to go. The donor will match all donations (dollar for dollar) up to \$10,000.

What can I do to help the Mid-Ohio Valley move to a clean energy future?

By increasing FUUSM's use of solar energy, we're decreasing the carbon footprint of our city and the MOV. So we're reaching out beyond our walls to invite others in the community who support renewable energy to be part of our project.

Perhaps you'd like to add a solar installation to your own property, but your house isn't suitable: The roof line faces the wrong directions, and you have too many trees in your yard that you don't want to cut down for a free-standing unit.
