landmark. Wayne is an active participant at public meetings in Parkersburg, including working to make sure the sidewalks and streets are safe. He loves to travel, and our community was relieved when he and Lee narrowly escaped death in 2022 when a plane they had chartered to pick them up at Wood County Airport crashed in Marietta. They have residences in Parkersburg, Prague, Florida, and New York.
