We work together to make it work, and friendship is one of many perks.


To some this may come of surprise, but to see it you must open your eyes.

## March 13 Hour of Environmental Action: The Effects of DOGE on Environmental Issues

It's so easy to be angry, disheartened, and frightened about actions the White House and DOGE have implemented since the inauguration. It's much harder to DO SOMETHING about it. That's what the Hour of Environmental Action intends to figure out: How can we do something meaningful and effective to plant seeds of positive change to protect Mother Earth and all her children?

The third Hour of Environmental Action will be at 7 p.m., March 13, and the topic will shine a light on the effects on federal government cuts and funding freezes on programs and agencies that deal with environmental issues, including climate change, natural resources, energy policy, and more. As usual, we plan to spend the first 15 or 20 minutes with a presentation from an expert on the topic, and then the remaining hour figuring out what is the most effective thing we can do about this situation: whom should we call or write to, and what words would be most effective to state?

The Green Sanctuary Committee invites you to join us (and co-host Mid-Ohio Valley Climate Action) for Merlyn Climate Grants **Climate Future Film Festival**, right here at FUUSM in the social hall. We plan two, free-admission screenings:

Thursday, March 20, at 7 p.m. repeated on Saturday, March 22, at 2 p.m.

This traveling festival of award-winning short films explores the full range of human and artistic response to what may be coming next. The 10 short films—drama, satire, comedy, films of hope and films of sadness, documentary and animation—were created by filmmakers from four different continents

**Bill McKibben**, one of America's leading voices and authors on climate, is the Festival's Honorary Judge and introduces it on screen.

## The Roller Coaster of Change

This is a concept developed by Stephen Haines, founder and CEO of the Haines Centre for Strategic Management. It serves as a framework to understand the natural. normal, and highly predictable cycles individuals experience during change. Haines emphasizes that change is an individual, emotional, and psychological process, and that productivity and quality often decline before improvements are realized. He outlines a six-stage model to navigate these cycles effectively:
